In this context, it is crucial to provide *unwavering support to young individuals with exceptional talent*, ensuring their comprehensive training while also nurturing merit, regardless of their economic and social backgrounds. Additionally, it is essential to *cultivate advanced research environments* that prioritize innovation within both public and private institutions, *enabling talent utilization to drive progress.*

Recognizing talent, fostering it and putting it to good use requires a collective effort. Public measures, while necessary, are not enough on their own. Similarly, the actions of private stakeholders alone fall short. Making talent operational, achieved through merit recognition, is a matter of "general interest".

The recommended operational tool is the establishment of a *participatory foundation*, recognized as a philanthropic organization under the recent Third Sector reform. This private, not-for-profit organization is distinguished by streamlined and efficient governance, guaranteeing elevated levels of **transparency, reporting, and the opportunity for impact benchmarking**. Not only will the organization operate in pursuit of civic, solidarity and social utility goals, but also engage in fundraising activities to allocate economic resources, goods, and services, supporting interventions aimed at unleashing "talent." These efforts are consistent with a strategic plan co-developed with the participants.

The primary objectives are:

- leveraging our collective expertise, along with support from members and external partners, to enhance the initiatives of the Sant'Anna School of Advanced Studies in talent training and applied research. This includes promoting the growth of these activities and upgrading School facilities, whether movable or immovable;
- formulating proposals and driving initiatives to strengthen the research and training system in Pisa, in close collaboration with the Scuola Normale Superiore and the University of Pisa. The goal is to nurture the potential of young talents and contribute value to both the local community and the nationwide system.
